AGES 9-12 = COMPLETE 8 ACTIVITIES


AGES 13+ = COMPLETE 10 ACTIVITIES




#### Activity 5: Famous Hoosiers

Help Rail Ranger Julia identify the famous Hoosiers by connecting a linefrom their name to their picture.












#### Activity 6: Hoosier Train Dot-to-Dot
